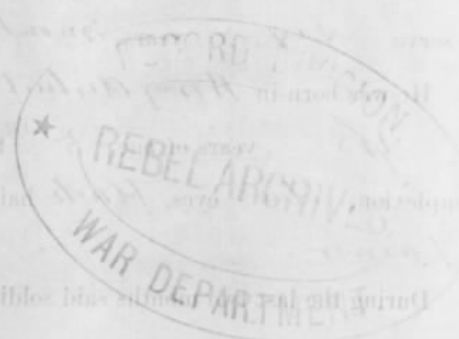

CERTIFICATE OF DISABILITY FOR DISCHARGE.

Private *Thos. D. Lovel* of Captain *A. H. Johnson's*
Company (D) of the *3^d* Regiment of *State Troops*
was enlisted by *Capt. A. H. Johnson* of the *State Troops*
at *Harry* on the *18th* day of *July 1863*
to serve *six* years, *months*.

He was born in *Harry District* in the State of *South Carolina*
is *45* years of age, *5* feet *8* inches high, *dark*
complexion, *blue* eyes, *black* hair, and by occupation, when enlisted,
